

BYLAWS OF THE WU WEI INSTITUTE

TITLE I — NAME, NATURE, HEADQUARTERS, AND DURATION

Art. 1 The Wu Wei Institute is a private civil association of a scientific, educational, cultural, and research nature, non-profit, with administrative, financial, and asset autonomy, established for an indefinite duration, governed by these Bylaws, the Brazilian Civil Code, and applicable legislation.

Art. 2 The Institute is headquartered in the Municipality of Franca, State of São Paulo, and may establish offices, research centers, care units, educational hubs, and representation offices anywhere in Brazil or abroad.

Art. 3 The Institute may use the name *Wu Wei Institute* in international activities.

TITLE XIX — DISSOLUÇÃO (DISSOLUTION)

In the event of dissolution, the remaining net assets shall be allocated to another non-profit entity with a compatible purpose, subject to applicable law and the deliberation of the General Assembly.

TITLE XX — FINAL PROVISIONS

Omitted cases shall be resolved by the General Assembly, observing applicable legislation.

These Bylaws come into force on the date of their registration at the competent Civil Registry of Legal Entities.
